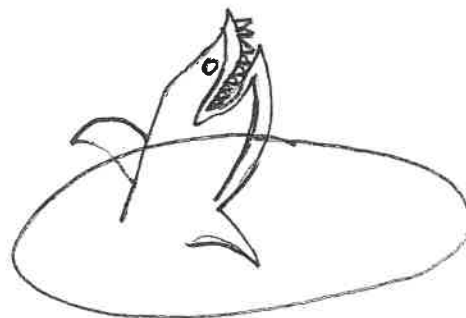
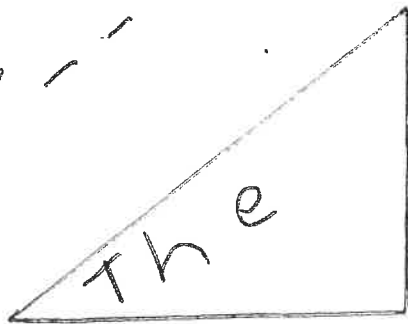
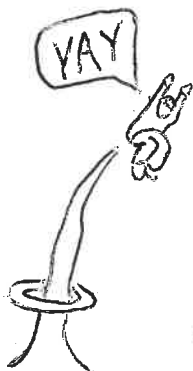
Simile - "Hungry like the wolf." (Duran Duran)

There might be a fire or a car chase in a movie. It is not real. Someone who knows how to do stunts makes it look real. This is Mr. Forster's job.

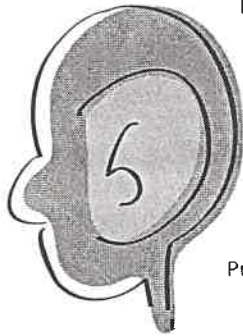
